## **SYNOPSIS**

Every Saturday morning, locals of a remote village in Georgia's mountainous region of Racha take a bus to the weekly bazaar in the nearest larger town to sell their goods and make purchases.

The observational documentary short film Bazaar Bus follows the villagers on their journey to the market and gives a very atmospheric feeling for the hardship of this long summer day.





### **ABOUT MAGNUS LORENZ**

Magnus Lorenz is a documentary filmmaker, usually embodying the roles of a director, cinematographer and editor to produce creative documentary formats with strong personal angles and rhythmic structures.

Equipped with a master's diploma in documentary filmmaking, Magnus has cultivated his unique cinematic and storytelling styles. In 2018 Magnus won the 'Best Film' Award' at the prestigious Aristoteles Documentary Film Workshop in Romania for 'You'll Be A Woman Soon'.

Magnus lives and works in Berlin and Tbilisi.

### **ABOUT ARTELI RACHA**

Arteli Racha is an art center located in a remote mountainous region of Georgia. It hosts an artist residency and a yearly art festival called ART-RA. The aim of Arteli Racha – led by well-known artist Kote Jincharadze – is to implement various art projects and to create a public dialogue about art in the Racha region.

Magnus Lorenz created the film 'Bazaar Bus' during a one-week residency stay at Arteli Racha, where he worked closely with the local community and the other participating artists Kote Jincharadze, Natia Benashvili and Marius Abramavicius.

At the end of their residency, the artist group exhibited their work results in the Oni Local Lore Museum and the Ambrolauri Museum of Fine Arts.
